

Academic Year 2026/2027 GA Stipend Rates

The current collective bargaining agreement between the GEU-UAW and the University expires June 30, 2026. As the successor agreement is currently being negotiated, the stipend rates may be adjusted pursuant to the renegotiated contract upon its effective date.

Retroactive and/or non-standard appointment dates require advance approval from The Graduate School.

Percentage of Employment:

Minimum appointment for a graduate assistantship is 50% (10 hours per week). GAs may be appointed on graduate payroll for anywhere between 10-20 hours per week.

- 100% = 20 hours per week
- 75% = 15 hours per week
- 50% = 10 hours per week

Level Descriptions:

Criteria for stipend levels may be found in the [Graduate Catalog](#) under "Assistantships, Fellowships, and Other Aid". Questions about GA stipend levels may be directed to the payroll processor listed on the offer letter or gradschool@uconn.edu.

- Level 1 – For GAs with at least a baccalaureate degree (as noted in the Graduate Employee Union contract as "Beginners [Pre-Masters]").
- Level 2 – For GAs in a doctoral program with at least a master's degree or its equivalent in the field of graduate study (as noted in the Graduate Employee Union contract as "Masters or Equivalent"). Equivalency consists of 30 credits of appropriate graduate-level coursework beyond the baccalaureate degree, together with admission to a doctoral program. (If the previously completed master's degree was used to satisfy the equivalency of a bachelor's degree for purposes of admission, the degree does not count toward Level 2 eligibility.)
- Level 3 – For GAs enrolled in a doctoral program who have passed all parts of the doctoral general exam and have the milestone reflected on their academic record (as noted in the Graduate Employee Union contract as "PhD Candidate").
